Successful candidates will have the foundation, preparation and vision to pursue a productive career in academic neurosurgery.

Required Skills

Basic Qualifications:

The candidate must possess an MD or MD/PhD or equivalent, have earned ABNS board certification/eligibility, and have completed specialized training in spinal neurosurgery.

A postgraduate spine fellowship is preferred, but those with a strong enrolled fellowship will be considered.

Experience with minimally invasive techniques and managing complex spinal deformity is desired. The successful candidate will be expected to develop and maintain an active neurosurgical clinical practice, conduct clinical and/or basic science research, and teach residents and medical students as part of a multidisciplinary team at the UC Davis Spine Center in Sacramento, which includes Orthopedics, PM&R, Pain, and Radiology.

All candidates must have or be able to obtain a California medical license and Fluoroscopy Supervisor and Operator Permit.
