Description

The undergraduate Department of Community Health at Tufts University invites applications for a full time, non-tenure track faculty position at the rank of Lecturer for the academic year 2018-2019. The search is open, but there is a particular interest in the area of global health. Subfields or areas of expertise could include one or more of the following: intervention or implementation research on health programs and policies, communicable or non-communicable diseases, health and climate change, and data science, involving the use of quantitative methods to analyze large datasets.

The faculty member is expected to teach undergraduate courses in the department, advise undergraduate Community Health students on course planning, senior honors theses, and other matters related to the department; and participate in department, school, and university-wide service. The position includes teaching and service with full 9-month salary support

Qualifications

Candidates must hold a doctoral degree in a field relevant to community health at the time of application. Relevant fields include: public health, social behavioral science, epidemiology, biostatistics, health policy, environmental health, or a related health or social science field. University-level teaching experience is required and experience with undergraduates is preferred. A successful candidate will demonstrate a clear commitment to teaching excellence at the undergraduate level, working with a diverse student population, and dedication to collaboration with faculty within and beyond the department, such as other departments within the School of Arts and Sciences, the Tisch College for Civic Engagement, the Tufts School of Medicine, and the Friedman School of Nutrition Science and Policy.
